## Annual Fire Hydrant Flushing

- Fire hydrant flushing will be performed on May 14th - 15th from 0600 to 1700.
- Fire hydrant flushing will include all fire hydrants base wide, as well as all housing areas at Great Lakes, RTC, Camp Paul Jones, and FHCC.
- Each hydrant on base will be flushed for approximately 5-15 minutes
- As a result of the flushing, you may experience discolored water on these days. If you do notice discolored water, run your water for 5 to 15 minutes until it clears up. Exercise caution when laundering whites during these times to prevent discoloring of laundry items.
- For your safety, if you are traveling by vehicle or on foot, do not attempt to cross the path of any hydrant water flow, it may seem harmless but injuries or property damage could result.

## Raised Bed Gardens & Sheds

If you want to plant a seasonal garden or put up a shed, BOTH would only be permitted in a fenced in backyard. Garden MUST be a raised bed garden style. If you do not have a fenced in back yard, gardens and sheds would not be permitted, as the landscapers would have to navigate around the structure or garden and this will not be possible. Special Services Request must be completed and approved before adding either to your yard. Thank you for your cooperation!

## Smoke Detectors Save Lives!

NEVER, NEVER, NEVER disconnect your smoke detector! They are in your homes to alert you and they save lives. Disconnecting the device is a lease violation and more importantly, puts you and your family and/or neighbors in jeopardy!

Residents are responsible for replacing batteries in smoke detectors and thermostats. If smoke detector is too high, please place a work order. Work orders can be placed 24/7 by calling 847-689-4312. Press 1 and listen to the prompts. For emergencies or routine and you will be connected to a LIVE person at the Call Center.
